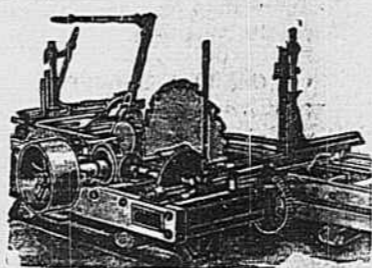

Treasurer's Notice.

The County Treasurer's office will be open for the purpose of receiving taxes from the 15th day of Oct. 1909 to the 15th day of March 1910 inclusive. A penalty of one per cent will be added to all unpaid taxes after the 1st day of Jan. to the 31st of Jan. 1910, of two per cent, from the 1st day of Feb. to the last day of Feb. 1910 and penalty of five per cent from the first day of March to the 15th day of March 1910. A capitation tax of 50 cents each is to be paid on all dogs. A commutation road tax of \$2.00 each must be paid by able bodied male citizens between the ages of 18 and 50 years.
