Auditor's Notice.
All persons owning property of any kind whatsoever, or in any capacity, as husband, guardian, executor, administrator or trustee are required to make returns of the same to the Auditor under oath within the time mentioned below and the Auditor is required by law to add a penalty of 50 per cent to all property that is not returned on or before the 20th day of February in any year.
All male citizens between the ages of 21 and 60 years except those exempt by law are deemed taxable polls.
The township assessors are respectfully requested to meet at the appointments for taking tax returns in their respective township and they are also required to make tax returns for those who fail to make their own within the time prescribed by law. The 50 per cent penalty will be added for failure to make returns.
