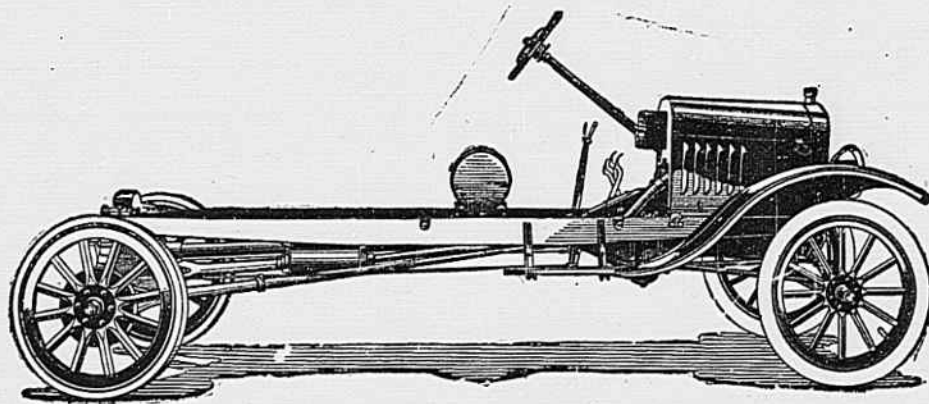

#### Cholera Still Among Hogs.

Cholera is still raging among hogs in this county. All swine owners are asked to co-operate with the agriculture and hog cholera men to control this dreadful disease. Be sure to see a veterinarian or your County Agriculture Agent should sickness occur among your hogs. Be certain to burn all the dead ones and kill the buzzard to keep him from spreading the disease.

#### Hogs May be Shipped From County.

Provided enough hogs can be collected together, a car will be shipped to the northern markets by the agricultural men.

Those farmers who have hogs that can be put in this car are asked to notify County Agent A. B. Carwile, or Mr. J. D. Kemp before the 7th of May and furnish the following information: Number of hogs; weights; whether finish or unfinished. Please get this in at once.

In case we can get a car load, the hogs will be graded and marketed by a Clemson College expert and all details handled by this man. These hogs should bring from 14 cents to 18 cents per pound.
