They should not be sent federal officials or else they should not bear the names of the public officers and
employes designated in the act."

After quoting the attorney gen eral's opinion in full the executive order reads:
I hereby call the attention of 1 officers und employes in the federal service to the foregoing provisisions of warn them that the construed are to be by them obey ed and enforced.
Any ofticial in the federal ser vice may without jeopardy to the
