upon the toes in a perpendicular position several times a day this deformity could be easily rectified. To do this properly one must be in a perfectly upright position, the arms drooping at the side, the heels well together and the toes forming an angle of forty-five degrees. The rise should be made very slowly and from the balls of both feet, and the descent should be accomplished in the same way, without swaying the body out of its perpendicular line. The exercise is not an easy one, but may be accomplished by perseverance and patience. It can be modified, too, by standing first on one leg, then on the other. Inflating and raising the chest at the same time is a part of the exercise, and if persevered in will ultimately show and increased chest measurement, development of lung power, and perfectly straight and erect figure.

Weights and Measures.
In regard to the matter of standard weights the law of nearly all Southern States have fixed the weight of our agricultural products, so far as the bushel unit goes. It is true that many grocery men do not observe the rule in selling fruits and vegetables, as it is much more convenient to use measures than to employ the scales in selling them. What is wanted is a law that shall be uniform throughout the whole country, and which should be forced to be observed. Even eggs and poultry generally should be sold by the pound. The following are the standard weights of most farm products, as fixed by statutes in the different States:

- 60 pounds wheat one bushel.
56 pounds shelled corn.
70 pounds ear corn.
48 pounds corn meal.
60 pounds peas
56 pounds eye.
32 pounds oats.
46 pounds barley.
60 pounds Irish potatoes.
55 pounds sweet potatoes.
37 pounds onions.
32 pounds cotton seed.
20 pounds bran.
50 pounds coarse salt.
53 pounds fine salt.
60 pounds white beans.
45 pounds castor beans.
