up to this hour the election in this State passed off quietly, with the exception of a fatal shooting affair in Greenwood county, near Greenwood, in which young Etheredge, white, lost his life at the hands of a buck negro. As soon as the news of the murder became known bands of armed white men congregated at the scene of murder and the search for the murderer began. Tolbert and Headerson, two young white men who are said to have incited the negroes to commit deeds of violence, were captured and executed without judge or jury. Our information is that large bands of whites from Edgefield, Laurens and contiguous counties are hurrying to the scene of the disturbance and the gravest apprehension is felt for the safety of the negroes implicated in the murder. There was a very light vote in this State. To account for this we have only to say that in this State a nomination in the Democratic primary is virtually an elec-Out of a Democratic vote of about 400 only 88 votes were polled yesterday at this place, and this poll may be taken as a basis for an estimate for what the vote of the county will be.


