

No More Troops To Go To China.

Since the capture of Pekin by the allied forces the important development in the Chinese situation today was the decision of over government not to send any more troeps to China. All the troops now at sea, amounting to about 4,000, together with those under orders for service in the far east which have not sailed, amount ing to about 3.000 more, will be sent to Manila. These troops will sail on the same route and upon touching at Nagasaki will go on to Manila, unless there are developments in China not now expected which would make their presence in that country necessary. Secretary Root said that no more troops were being sent to China because they were not needed. With the arrival at Taku of the steamer Hancock and the troops she carried General Chaffee will have 5,000 available men, which is thought to be sufficient for all present purposes. The decision of the department was not based upon any recommendation made by Gen. Chaffee, but upon reports received by him, which made it apparent that no more troops were

Lewes, Del., Aug 30 .- The battleship Alabams, which has completed her official trip, arrived at the Delaware breakwater this morning on bec way to Philadelphia. where she will soon be formally turned over to the government.
