ssessment of taxes, (Revised Statutes,) reads as follows: All property shall be valued for taxation at its true value in money, which in all cases not specially provided for by law, shall be held to be as follows, to wit: For personal property the usual selling price on the usual terms of similar property at administrator's or executor's sales, at the p'ace were the return is made; and for real property, the usual selling price on the usual terms of similar property at sales for partition under order of court, at the place where the return is to made. If here is no usual selling price, then at what is honestly believed could be obtain-

ed for the same at a fair sale under the conditions above mentioned. It shall be the duty of each owner of lands, and of any new structures thereon which shall not have been appraised for taxation, to list the same for taxation with they may be situated, on or before the 20th day of February next, after the same shall ecome subject to taxation.
Section 6 That from and after the pas

sage of this act, there shall be assessed upon all taxable polls in this State " tax o one dollar on each poll, the preceeds of which tax shall be applied solely to educational purposes. Every male citizen be tween the ages of twenty-one and sixty years, except those incapable of earning a support, from being maimed or from other causes, and except those who are made ex empt by law, shall be deemed taxable polls. All returns for taxation must be filed with the Auditor not later than February 20th, 1901, as after that date the law requires an addition of 50 per cent. to the last year's return
