The State is collecting a good deal mors taxes now than it collected 10 or years ago. That, as the records will show. The general texee-that is taxes on property alone-amounted in 1888 to $\$ 582,61178$; in 1901 they amounted to $\$ 808,58240-\mathrm{a}$ difference ot nearly a quarter of million. The total income last year from the gene, was $\$ 3,391,774.87$ : togeth with a cash balance of $\$ 626,912.05$, making altogether $\$ 4,018,68692 \mathrm{Th}$ expenditures were $\$ 3,780,94367$, leaving a cash balance to be carried over to 1902 of $\$ 237,745.25$.
