nature. There is no doubt that the Governor will sign the bill as he has been in sympathy with it from its inception.
The bill will go before the people for acceptance or rejection on Febru ary 1 nesf, The distance from church or school house where a sa-
loon may be situated is fixed at 200 feet. One-balf of the license and fines arising under the law will go to the State and one-half to the town or city.
