Hadley Sees Light.

New Haven, April 22.—That the North was in error in giving the negro the ballot when it did was the opinion expressed by President Hadley of Yale in a lecture in a discourse on "citizenship."

President Hadley said of the award of the ballot to the negro: "It was not the fault of the negro; it was not the fault of those who gave him the ballot without previous preparation. The same thing was true in Italy before that and in Russia. The North did not recognize this at the close of the war. They recognized the dictum that all men were born free and equal. When the North recognized the condition which prevailed in the South it acquiesced in the suppression of the negro vote. The fact that the negro vote was restricted showed that it was inevitable."

"I shall not attempt to predict the outcome, but one thing should be said; the error of those who said, thirty years ago, that the negro could be given the ballot before he was prepared for it was no greater than that of those who, today, think those rights can be withheld from him after he is developed and ready for them."

Two thousand combatants were engaged, both using side arms. Sixty were killed and three hundred were wounded. Troops were called to restore order.
