**A Fish Experiment.**

Washington, July 9—The United States Fish commission is about to undertake an experiment, the outcome of which is fraught with commercial importance. It is proposed to introduce a large number of Pacific coast salmon into the waters of the Atlantic in an effort to build up a salmon industry on the Eastern coast to rival that of the Western coast. Experts of the commission are now engaged in making an investigation of the waters inhabited by the Atlantic coast salmon to gather additional facts regarding its habits, food, growth and life. They will make a study of the coastal waters of the New England states. Some eight or ten years ago the commission made a similar experiment, but it was a failure. About 5,000,000 fish were released and disappeared. Different methods are to be pursued this time and it is hoped that better results may be obtained.
