David Solomon Meetze was born in Lexington county, S. C., March 20, 1837, and died October 4, 1903, making his sojourn on earth 66 years, 6 months and 14 days. He was united in holy wedlock to Anna E. Ballentine July 9, 1863, making a union of a little more than 40 years. To them were born 5 children, 2 sons and 3 daughters, 1 of the latter having preceeded him to the spirit land by the space of 9 years. There are also 9 grand children. These with the faithful consort, and host of friends are left to mourn his departure. At the beginning of the Civil war, he enlisted in Leaphart's company, 20th Regiment, and made a valiant soldier.

From early manhood he had been an intense sufferer. Since his 12th year, he had rheumatism, and for 13 or 14 years he suffered also from heart trouble. To these, he finally succumbed.

In infancy he was baptized, and at a mature age confirmed in Bethel Evangelical Lutheran church serving as an elder, until incapacitated for these duties by declining health. **Street Car Collision.**

New York, Nov. 25.—The third collision within six days on the Brooklyn Rapid Transit system occurred this morning on an incline at Jamaica and Railroad avenues, east New York. Fifty were injured. 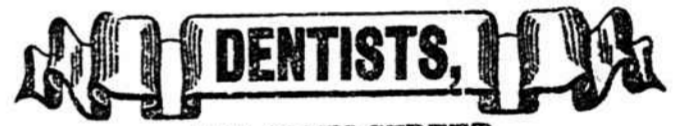
