An Accident.

A few weeks ago we called the attention of the County Commissioners to the unsafe condition of the roadway over factory pond and warned them that unless something was soon done to make crossing safe for animals and pedestrians the county might be called upon to defend a suit for damages. Last Wednesday afternoon while engaged in hauling goods from the depot to the Lexington Department Store, a horse belonging to this company became frightened at something and before it could be brought under control, backed off the upper edge of the brige carrying wagon, driver and all with it into the waters below. Fortunately the wagon came uncoupled and the horse swam with the two front wheels to the bank, the driver managed to extricate himself from the debris and managed to reach land more frightened than hurt. The body and other parts of the wagon were recovered several days later. We do not know whether or not a damage suit against the county will follow.

Pensions.

It is probable that persons who are entitled to draw a pension from the State, will get their money earlier this year than they did last. It will be necessary for the State to borrow \$200,000 to pay the pensions as appropriated by the legislature this year. A number of applications have been turned down by the State Board for various reasons, consequently some will be disappointed.

New Trial Granted.

The Supreme Court has given Mr. R. W. McDaniel a new trial. Mr. McDaniel was convicted of killing Mr. Neese, the policeman at Swansea, last Christmas a year ago, and was sentenced to the penitentiary for life, upon recommendation of the jury. His is a remarkable case and is interesting to the legal fraternity.

The Texas Cotton Crop.

Houston, Tex., March 29.—Reports from all over the state indicate that the cotton crop is nearly all planted. Good rains have fallen and the weather is perfect. It is expected two hundred thousand bales of new cotton will be put on the market during August owing to early planting.

Water From Congaree Creek.

The plan to utilize the waters of Congaree creek in this county to supply the mill district of Columbia with pure drinking water is assuming shape. A corps of Engineers representing the American Engineering Company, is in Columbia looking over the field for the purpose of devising the best plans for securing an adequate supply of drinking water. It is possible that Congaree creek will be utilized for this purpose. It is proposed to run a pipe line from the creek to the mill district of Columbia.
