TAX NOTICE. I WILL ATTEND THE FOLLOWING I mentioned places for the purpose of receiving taxes for the fiscal year 1904:

Red Bank, Saturday evening, Dec. 3. The balance of the time at Lexington Court House until December 31st, 1904, after which time the following penalties will be added by the County Auditor and collected by the County Treasurer:

On January 1st, 1905, 1 per cent. penalty will be added to those who have not paid. On February 1st, 1905, an additional 1 per cent. will be added to those who have not paid, making 2 per cent. for February. Still an additional 5 per cent. penalty will be added on March 1st, making 7 per cent. penalty to be paid by those who have not paid by March 1st, 1905.

Tax books will close March 15th, 1905. The hours for closing the tax book will positively be at 11 o'clock for the morning and 4 o'clock for the afternoon appointments.

Commutation Road Tax \$3.00, payable from October 15th to March 1st, 1905. Parties owning property in more than one township must so state to the Treasurer. When writing for information concerning taxes always give name in full.
