Letter from Texas.

To The Editor of the Dispatch:

As there is no one at this place corresponding to the Lexington Dispatch and, too, I have never wrote from this place, I will now attempt to send you a few items, as I guess that my Lexington friends will be glad to hear from me. I left Columbia, Nov 1, 1904, arriving in Navasots, Texas, the Nov. 3rd, 1904, making my journey three days and two nights. I Passed through several beautiful cities and towns, and some very good farming land

I am now here in Texas to dance with the boll weevil in the coming sommer.

I spent several days in Navasota with my cousin, R B Hendrix, and family, enjoying a very pleasant time. I afterwards thought that I would visit Ruans Prairie, my old home place, the place of my birth 22 years ago. This little town is 25 miles, north east of Navasota located on the I and G

N Railroad. I found that the folks at this little

town are very friendly and social. It had been a good while since I had laid my eyes on these grounds, (18 years) though some of the buildings and grounds looked natural. I was not hardly old enough to remember very much how things looked as I was only four years of age when my parents moved from this place.

The land grows very nearly every thing that farmers need.

Cotton is the principal crop, corn is raised with great ease, farm all the year through with improved riding plows.

The lands are level and smooth. Roads are extra good in dry weather but in rainy they are somewhat sticky.

There is a beautiful Methodut church erected on the prairie with a very good memberships. Servic s fourth Sunday a. m and 7 p. m Rev. Adams, pastor. On the same grounds is a nice school house is erected, where a flourishing school is conducted

Roans Prairie has only been blessed with a R. R. a short time, about two years.

The little town (Roans Prairie) is building up very rapidly, and contains six stores and is in good shape for more now soon. I am now eij ying the ring of the anvil, the principal work being horse shoeing. Aud, too, I am on the lookout for a little maid to shoo the chickens. So while I shoe the horses she can shoo the chickens Well, Xmas, has come and gone and I think that every body enjoyed that day. I had a special invitation to Mr. S M Am'ck's, near by, whice I fulfilled, and had a pleasant time. We have had some very cold weather for the past few days, but not too cold for the young to marry, as there have been very numerous ceremonies around. Mr. Oscar Hendrix, of Navasota, was in our section during the Xmas, holidays. We were very glad to see him and hope that he will soon come to the Prairie again. Mrs. J. W. Gates and two daughters, Lily Belle and Vivian, spent a few days in Navasota with relitives last week. Well, I will not write a long letter this time, as the dinner table is waiting on me and a big fat turkey will not do to miss. 



Navy Cadetship.

Congressman A. F. Lever of the seventh district has been called upon by the navy department to nominate a candidate for appointment as midshipman in the United States Naval scademy. A competitve examination of all applicants will be held in Columbia on Saturday, Feb. 4:b, at 9 30 s. m. to govern in the naming of a principal and two alternates.

Applicants must be between the ages of 16 and 20 years and bona fide residents of the seventh congressional district. In addition to the mental examination each applicant will be required to pass a satisfactory physical examination, conducted by a reputable physician at Columbia.

Those who desire to take the examination should write Congressman Lever for permission to do so, giving some well known person in their community as reference. Full information will be given upon application to him at Washington, D. C.
