### PRESIDENCY COMES HIGH

Figures as to Cost of the Recent Election.

Washington, April 27—Did the late Mark Hanna spend sixteen and a half million dollars on the McKinley-Bryan campaign of 1896 in aid of the Republican administration? That is the question people are asking since the statement made on the floor of the house a day or two ago by Representative Sulzer, of New York, while discussing the national publicity bill. The difference between Hanna's sixteen million of gold and Bryan's half million of silver is too great, they say, to carry great weight with it. His figures, they believe, are pulled too wide apart, especially as Bryan, in 1896, had the silver interests of the country back of him and could, and did, probably spend much more than the sum accredited to him.

Lincoln was a good spender when it came to politics. In his race against Stephen A. Douglass for the presidency he spent \$100,000, while his Democratic opponent used just half that amount. Four years later, in 1864, Lincoln, when opposed by George B. McClellan, spent \$125,000 and McClellan \$50,000. Grant, in his first campaign in 1868 against Horatio Seymour, spent \$150,000, while the latter used \$75,000. In his second campaign Grant spent \$250,000, and Horace Greeley \$50,000. In 1876 Rutherford B. Hayes spent \$950,000, then a large amount, as against practically the same sum in behalf of Samuel J. Tilden. Two years later James A. Garfield, running for president against W. S. Hancock, used \$1,100,000, and the latter, \$355,000. When James G. Blaine opposed Cleveland the first time in 1884, it cost \$1,300,000 and Cleveland used a little more—\$1,400,000. In 1888 Benjamin Harrison used \$1,350,000, and Cleveland \$855,000, while in 1892 the same candidates cost their supporters \$1,850,000 and \$2,350,000, respectively. Cleveland again using more than his Republican opponent. In 1896 McKinley is said to have spent \$16,500,000 through Mark Hanna, if Representative Sulzer's figures are correct, while William J. Bryan spent \$675,000. In 1900 McKinley spent \$9,500,000 and Bryan \$425,000. While the Roosevelt-Parker campaign cost \$3,000,000 and \$1,250,000, respectively.

### The Dairy Bill Means Much to the South.

Washington, May 2.—Discussing his dairy bill that passed the house a day or two ago, Representative Lever said today: "The total value of dairy products of the United States for the year 1900 was over \$600,000. This industry is, therefore, one of the leading industries of the country. It has made the central Northwestern states enormously rich, and has added greatly to the aggregate wealth of the nation."

"In our section we not only fail to sell dairy products in the markets of the world, but we actually fail to supply the needs of our own markets. Our section spends annually for butter and cheese alone the enormous sum of \$38,000,000, products that could easily be raised at home."

"This appropriation of \$20,000 carried in the bill just passed, has in it the possibility of the creation of a new industry in the South and the saving to our people of an enormous

drain upon their resources.

"That this industry has not heretofore been developed is due to the fact that the entire attention of our people has been given to the development of the cotton industry."

"When this bill passes the senate, I understand it to be the purpose of the department of agriculture to employ a number of dairy experts who will work in cooperation with the State experiment station and with individual dairymen."

Many members of the house have congratulated Representative Lever on the passage by the house of his dairy bill—Columbia Record, May 2.

## Venezuela and Colombia.

Washington, May 3—Colombia and Venezuela are worse estranged than ever as a result of the refusal of Vice-President Gomez, of Venezuela, to receive Dr. Herrera, the minister plenipotentiary, who went to Caracas three weeks ago to perfect a treaty with Venezuela for the settlement of the disputes between the two South American governments.

War is being freely talked in South American diplomatic circles. The insult to Colombia is regarded by some of the diplomats here as one she cannot well overlook, especially since this is the second time the Castro government has refused to receive a representative of Colombia.

Latin-American diplomats are at a loss to know just how the Castro government expected the treaty to be perfected and signed, if the Venezuelans refused to receive the man empowered to act for Colombia, and there is much discussion of the unusual situation.
