Lexington County Teachers' Association.

The association held its regular meeting in the Institute building March 9, 1907. The morning being fine—zest to the occasion was lent. This proved a very pleasant and profitable meeting. Our president, Mr. J. F. Kyzer, presided over meeting. Prayer was offered by Rev. A. S. Leslie.

The first speaker on the program was Rev. A. S. Leslie, who gave a delightful address, the subject being: "Parents and Teachers' Influence Morally on the Student." The relationships of teacher and minister were closely traced by him. The elastic form of the word "Student" was clearly drawn. Then in a beautifully touching manner the mother's impress was portrayed. Of this several were mentioned. Of these mentioned was the mother of the Hebrew law giver of the old testament dispensation, "Moses." Also the mother of the noble Wesleys. This good mother left a Christian impress with her children of whom 17 were reared from 19. Close attention of those present was called to the unconscious influences that guide the mind of the child.

Here the teacher, like the mother, wielded her impress either for good or evil. Instances of noble type of man were cited as coming from our church colleges, due to noble Christian impressions imprinted by college presidents and instructors. These graces are absorbed by the student.

Prof. Hare, the next on the program, gave an interesting address on the "Need of the Dictionary in the Common School." He enumerated the faculties developed by a careful and systematic use of the dictionary. "The Present Adoption of Text Books" called forth remarks and criticisms from the teachers present. Occasionally we hope to have these books discussed by the members of the association. Secretary.

Ground to Death Under Box Car.

Macon, Ga., March 14.—Felix Tharpe, a night foreman of the Central's switching gang was ground to death under the wheels of a train of cars tonight at 8 o'clock at Bay street crossing. Tharpe was under one of a car engaged in jacking it up preparatory to repairs, when an engine bumped into the other end of the car, knocking it from the jacks and crushing Tharpe against the trackage.

There have been three violent deaths in Tharpe's family during the past six years. His father was cut to death in Macon several years ago. An older brother was shot to death in Alabama a little later, and now comes the third calamity the family bears.

Clears Up Mystery of Sub-Treasury.

Chicago.—The mystery surrounding the disappearance of \$173,000 from the Chicago sub-treasury, and which caused Chief Wilkie, of the Secret Service, to come to Chicago and take personal charge of the case, is said to be cleared up in the report which Captain Porter sent to Washington today. The report is said not only to contain a solution of the "mystery," but to give the names of the men implicated in the theft.

All of this except the sending of the report, Captain Porter denies. He asserts that all theories have been exploded, and that no new word has been received.

Further shortages have been found in the affairs of the sub-treasury, says Mr. Bantz, and Assorting Teller Fitzgerald is still liable, technically, for the money which disappeared from his cage. It is not asserted, however, that he will be so held.
