TWO WOMEN WILL HANG FOR MURDER

First Execution of Kind in New Mexico occurs on Friday, June 7th-Pretty Mexican Girl Gave Rat Poison to Her Aged Husband,

Albuqueque, N. M.-The first instances of the execution of a woman in New Mexico will occur at Hillsboro, Sierra county, on Friday, June 7th, when Valentia Madril, an educated Mexican woman, who administered poison to her husband, and Alma Lyons, a young negress, a servant in the Madril family, who assisted in the crime will be hanged.

Mrs. Madril is 19 years old, the negress is scarcely 20. Efforts are being made to have executive clemency extended the women, but it is not likely that the governor will interfere.

The crime for which the two women are to pay the penalty was a cold blooded one. The murder of Madril was carefully planned according to the statments of the two women between the wife, her paramour, Francisco Baca, and the negro servant. &

Madril, the murdered man, was possessed of considerable property and was one of the stable citizens of Sierra county. Madril was much older than his wife, and she soon began to tire of him. Then Baca appeared on the scene. He was young, of powerul build, rode a horse as only the hill countrymen of New Mexico can ride, and he soon captivated the young

Rough on rats was used by the woman, it being suggested by Baca. While the two women will hang, Baca has secured a continuance of his trial until the September term of court.

C., May 14.-A dynamite explosion in an abandoned tool house belonging to the Norfolk and Southern railway company, on the banks of the Neuse river, opposite this place, today probably fatally injured Frank McGhee, seriously injured Watson Fanning, of Sally, S. C., and slightly hurt several others. Standing at a distance of perhaps sixty feet and being ignorant of the contents of the tool house, McGhee fired at a knot on the building with a pistol. The bullet came in contact with the dynamite which has been stored for use in connection with construction work on the railroad, and an explosion followed, tearing the building into fragments, flying pieces striking those who were standing near-by.


