Tillman Says Prohibition Will Be Issue.

"Everything seems to tend toward prohibition in South Carolina and it is quite probable that the issue in the next campaign in the State will hinge on this point," said Senator Tillman in an interview here today.

"The trouble in South Carolina is the county boards of dispensaries and sooner or later it must change."

Discussing the national political question he said: "We are the poor man at the frolic and they are not giving us much attention. They intend to beat us in the next race and will probably do it on account of the great prosperity existing all over the country. I have just been in the north and northwest and they have so much money there the banks are overflowing. Big crops and big prices for years have left their mark there. But we are just as prosperous and full of life as they are anywhere in the country. I tell them everywhere that the goose is hanging just as high in Georgia and South Carolina as it is in Wall street or anywhere else north or west."

"I don't think there will be any trouble about the future financial conditions of the country for we have too much of everything the world needs to worry about any money matters. We can just sit steady in the boat and sail on."

"I've just come in from New York and the whole business world there have their eyes centered on the South and we are coming to the front, politics or no politics."

"I am going out west from here and will visit all the Pacific slope country before I come back."

Mr. Tillman is accompanied by his wife today and they have many friends in Augusta who are always glad to welcome them to the city.—Augusta Herald, 5th.

Wakefield, business agent of the Anderson Union, that the national meeting had decided on a minimum of fifteen cents for September cotton and that one-quarter of a cent would be added each succeeding month. The addition is to cover the costs of storage, etc.

Lightning Bolt Kills Seven Men.

Raleigh, N. C., Sept. 4.—Details of the disastrous effect of a lightning stroke at Buckhorn Falls, in Chatham county, yesterday, show that seven men were killed and ten injured. A heavy storm had forced fifty to seventy men to seek shelter in the cement house of the Buckhorn Falls power plant. Lightning struck a big tree back of the house and the tree splitting, fell over on the building, the stroke instantly killing two white men and five negroes and injuring three whites and seven negroes, all of them residents of this vicinity. All of the victims were employes of the Phoenix Construction company, which has charge of the plant.

Fear Chips.

Eight pounds pears, four pounds sugar, one-fourth pounds Canton ginger, four lemons. Wipe pears, remove stems, quarter and core; then cut in small pieces. Add sugar and ginger, and let stand over night. In the morning add lemons cut in small pieces, rejecting seeds, and cook slowly three hours. Put into a stone jar.

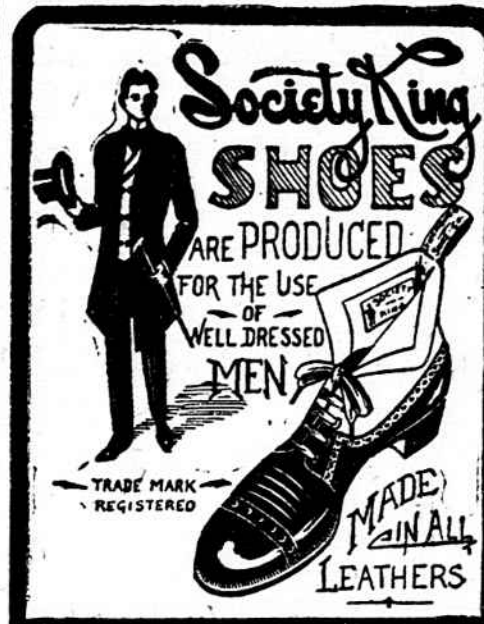
