Laurens, Sept. 25.—The case of the State vs. G. Wash Hunter, charged with the murder of Elbert Copeland in July, 1906, has been transferred to Greenwood county for its next trial. The change of venue was granted today by Judge Ernest Gary who is presiding over the sessions of the common pleas court here this week. This case has been tried four times in this county. The verdict in the first trial was for manslaughter and the other three resulting in mistrials.

Price of Cotton Seed.

The Southern Cotton Growers' Association and the Farmers' Union, at meetings held recently, fixed the minimum price of cotton seed at \$20 a ton which they regarded as a fair price under present conditions, and members of these organizations were urged to hold their seed until oil mills should pay the price. The demand for seed is so great, however, that the mills have gradually advanced the price until the current price of seed on the local market is \$22 a ton.

This price should be satisfactory to the farmers who desire to sell their seed, if they believe that \$20 is a fair price, and the mills should have no difficulty in obtaining all the seed needed to keep the mills running.—The Watchman and Southron.
