Max Gunnell Case Settled.

Max Gunnell, who shot a young man named Cannon in Brookland several months ago, was last week shot by Earle Womble while the two were out hunting. Gunnell was shot through the lung, several shots penetrating his organ, but he is said to be getting along fairly well.

In conversation yesterday with citizens of Brookland a reporter of The State learned that the case against Gunnell for shooting Cannon was not pressed by Solicitor Timmerman on payment of a certain sum agreed upon by the prosecutor. Another case in which a Brookland man was shot was also not pressed by the solicitor, that of S. J. Doyle, charged with shooting Murphy P. Hobbs. It is said that a case of assault and battery with a deadly and unlawful weapon could have been made out against each of these defendants, yet they were allowed to pay small sums instead of standing trial and receiving sentence as the law provides.—The State, 15th.
