While Under a Tree.

Laurens, July 9.—During the severe electric storm in this section yesterday afternoon Mr. E. McLees Cunningham, a well-to-do farmer, was struck and killed by lightning in a field, about a mile and a half from his home, in the Rocky Springs neighborhood, about five miles from here. Mr. Cunningham was in the field with his hands in the storm arose, and the presumption is that he took refuge under a big poplar tree, under which his body was found, which had been struck by the lightning. The field hands who were at work with Mr. Cunningham all went to the house, supposing that Mr. Cunningham had preceded them. However, when he did not make his appearance it caused uneasiness and a search was begun. The body was not found until 9:30 o'clock last night, when the party came upon it beneath a large tree. Life was extinct.
