## COL. J. C. HOPE DEAD.

On Saturday, July 17, Lexington county suffered the loss of one of her most prominent and highly respected citizens, Col. J. C. Hope, of Hope Station. After an illness of less than a week he succumbed to the terrible effects of internal blood poisoning.

In his death his native county and surrounding counties lost one of their most useful and distinguished citizens. Col. Hope was a man of the highest type of character and was the fortunate possessor of as many friends and acquaintances perhaps as any man in Lexington county. He was born in Lexington district August 23, 1845, and was the son of Senator John Christian Hope and Louise C. Hope. He was baptized in old historic St. John's Lutheran church on the first Sunday in November, 1845, by the Rev. Geo. Haltiwanger, Jr. He afterwards became a confirmed member of the same church and was always an active and faithful church member.

Numerically this division of the Hope family was a small one, Col. J. C. being the only male member of the family to survive and rear a family. He had only one sister, Mrs. Dr. L. C. Hobbs, and one brother, young John Julius, both of whom preceded him to the grave.

Col. Hope endured the hardships of the Confederate war. Had he been killed in that "great time" that tried men's souls" the Hope name would have become extinct in this part of country. He was a member of Company G of White's battalion, Light artillery, Capt. W. L. DePass' battalion. He surrendered in North Carolina under Gen. Joseph Johnson.

At the time of his death he was a member of Jas. D. Nance camp, No. 336, Newberry.

His immediate survivors are his wife, Mrs. Martha F. Hope, one daughter, Mrs. Mary L. Hipp, of Pomaria, Jno. J. Hope, of Columbia and four grandchildren.

Col. Hope was the uncle of Col. Jno. F. Hobbs, of New York and Dr. James H. Hobbs, of Chicago.

If articles of clothing, household linen and underwear are properly folded the ironing will be found much easier. Spread the articles to be dampened on the table one piece at a time. Sheets, pillow cases, towels and plain underwear should be dampened slightly, if at all. Tablecloths and plain underwear should be dampened slightly, if at all. Tablecloths and napkins and all starched things should be made very damp. Put all hems, selvages and corners together and fold. Roll starched articles in a cloth. Colored clothes should not be sprinkled until an hour or two before they are to be ironed. The most satisfactory way to sprinkle clothes is to use very hot water and a whisk broom.

When burning refuse in a stove, put a handful of salt into the fire with it and there will be no unpleasant odor.

Butter the kettle in which cereals are to be cooked before the water or milk is put in to prevent contents from sticking.
