Save Lemon Peel.
Don't throw away lemon peel. What you cannot use immediately for flavorings you can turn into essence of lemon quite a good as any can buy. To make it fill a bottle with rectified spirit, and, when using lemons, cut off the yellow part of the rind and place it in the spirit.
Orange essence may be made in the same way.
Emery powder and oil made into a paste is an excellent mixture to clean steel.
Rub on well and polish, after which rub with an oiled rag, and then polish up again with a clean duster.—Exchange.
