Taxpayers will, therefore, be prompt in meeting the appointments, so as not to cause delay.

At Lexington, C. H., all days not included in above schedule, from Jan. 1, 1910, to Feb. 20, 1910, when the books will close, after which 50 per cent. will be added for failure to make returns. Tax returns sent in by mail are not legal unless sworn to before an officer qualified to administer

All male persons are subject to poll tax from 21 to 60 years of age, except


