The family of Mr. Jesse Taylor have been quite ill with the gripe.

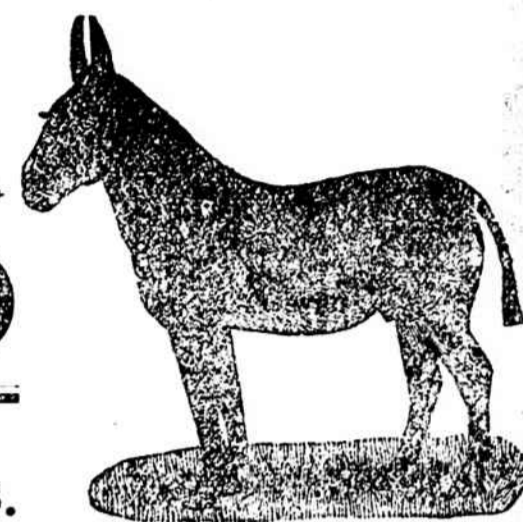
Mrs. H. M. Wingard has been quite indisposed for several days, much to the regret of her many friends.

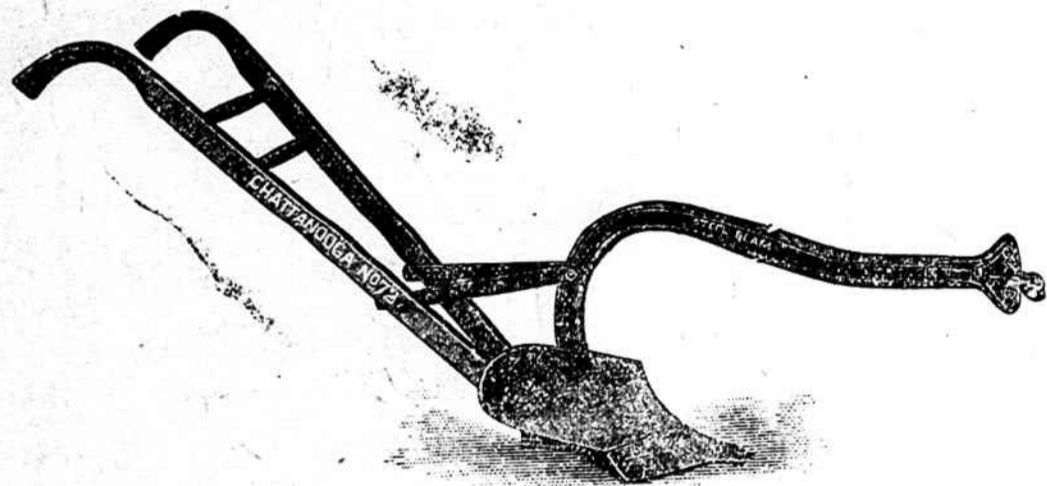

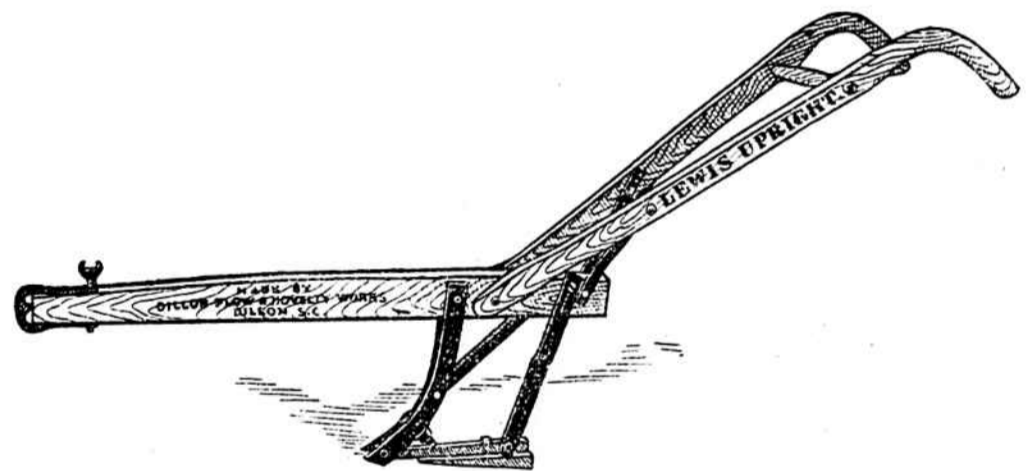

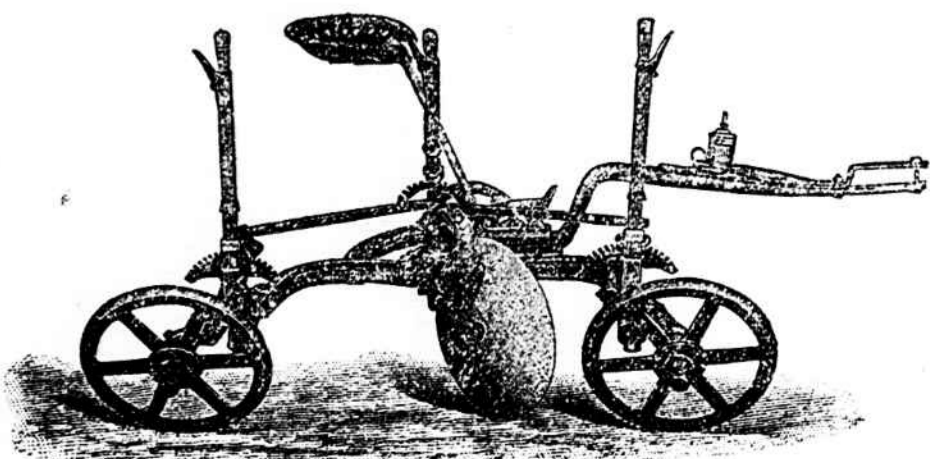
