The presidents of the Democratic clubs of Lexington county are hereby instructed to call a meeting of their clubs on Saturday, April 23rd, for re-organization and to elect delegates to the County convention to be held at the court house on Monday, May 2nd. It is important that the club meetings be well attended.

Each club should elect for the next two years, a president, one or more vice-presidents, a recording secretary, a treasurer and a member of the County Executive committee. There should be appointed a committee on registration, one on club enrollment and such others as the club may desire. Each club is entitled to one delegate to the County convention for each 25 members or majority fraction thereof, and the membership should be determined by the number of votes cast in the first primary of August, 1908.

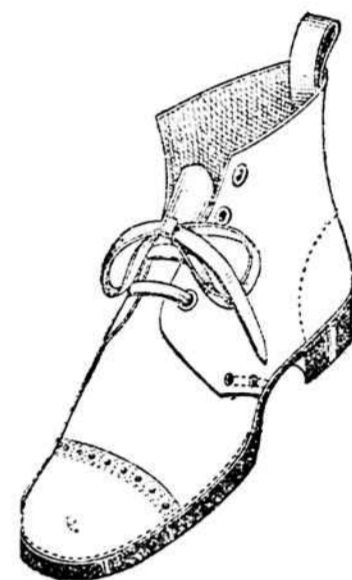

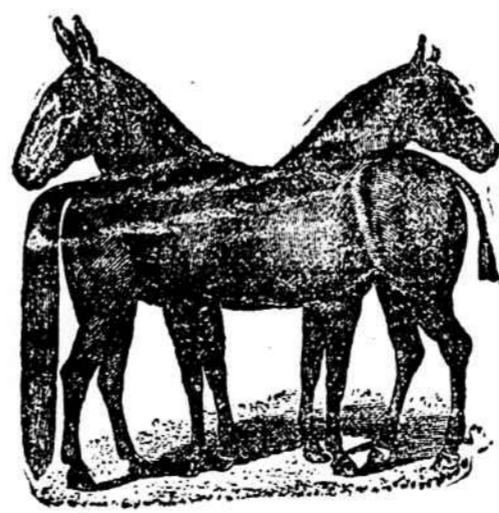
