Forcing their way into the Desha County jail at Dumas, Ark, between fifty and one hundred men, members of a mob formed so quietly that the authorities had not the slightest warning, overpowered the deputies in charge and took Charles Malpas, Sr., white, to a water tank and hanged him early Wednesday. 
