Richeson Hears Death Sentence.

Boston, Jan. 9.—With the appearance of a man who had abandoned all hope of life, the Rev. Clarence V. T. Richeson stood today at the bar of justice, declared his guilt of the pre-meditated murder of his former sweetheart, Avis Linnell, and without a tremor heard Judge Sanderson sentence him to death in the electric chair during the week beginning May 19. While displaying remarkable stoicism the young Virginian appeared to those who crowded the little court room, as if he were conducting his own funeral.

To the half dozen questions which Judge Sanderson put to Richeson he answered without the slightest emotion, always in the affirmative.

Richeson's counsel declared after the proceedings that an appeal for executive clemency would follow soon and that every effort would be made to obtain life imprisonment as the punishment.
