Taxpayers are hereby notified that by an ordinance duly enacted by the Town Council of the Town of Lexington, S. C., a levy of Ten (10) mills has been made on all the taxable property within the corporate limits of said Town for municipal purposes for the year 1912.

The tax books will be kept open by the undersigned, at his usual place of business in said town, for the collection of the said taxes as levied, from May 1, 1912, to May 30, 1912, both inclusive, after which time a penalty of five (5) per cent. will be added and the books kept open until June 15, 1912, for the collection of delinquent taxes and penalty.
