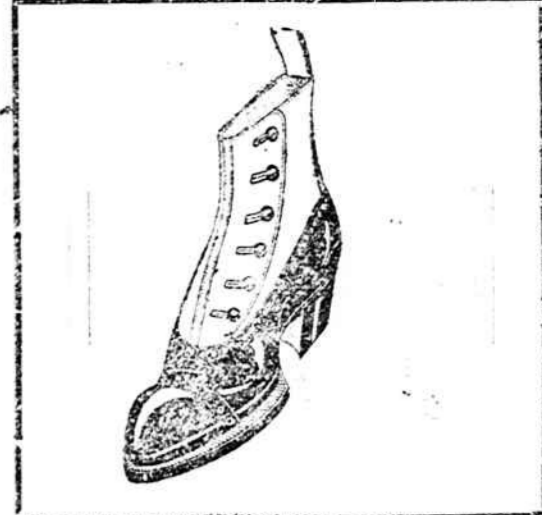

**Hookworm Dispensary Largely Attended Here.**

The dispensary that was opened in the court house last Saturday for the examination and free treatment of those suffering from the Hookworm was largely attended and attracted a great deal of attention. Of the forty persons examined, in the opinion of Dr. L. A. Riser, the expert in charge, thirty-five were affected with the disease. Most of those examined were children, and nearly everyone, it is said was affected. The dispensary will be open in the court house again next Saturday and every Saturday following until the six weeks are taken up. Dr. Riser wants to impress upon the people that the examination and treatment is absolutely free, the county and State bearing all expenses. Dispensaries are being operated at four other points in the county—Irmo, Batesburg, Steedman and Pelion.

According to law the County Auditor will add the following penalties:

On January 1st, 1913, 1 per cent. penalty will be added to those who have not paid. On February 1st, 1913, an additional 1 per cent. will be added to those who have not paid, making 2 per cent. penalty for February. Still an additional 3 per cent. penalty will be added on March 1st, making 7 per cent. penalty to be paid by those who have not paid by March 1st, 1913.

Tax Books will close March 15, 1913. When remitting give each township or school district your property is in. Give one name in full, not initials.
