Read instructions below before remitting:

According to law the County Auditor will add the following penalties:
On January 1st, 1913, 1 per cent. penalty will be added to those who have not paid. On February 1st, 1913, an additional 1 per cent. will be added to those who have not paid, making 2 per cent. penalty for February. Still an additional 5 per cent. penalty will be added on March 1st., making 7 per cent. penalty to be paid by those who have not paid by March 1st, 1913.
Tax Books will close March, 15, 1913. When remitting give each township or school district your property is in. Give one name in full, not initials.
