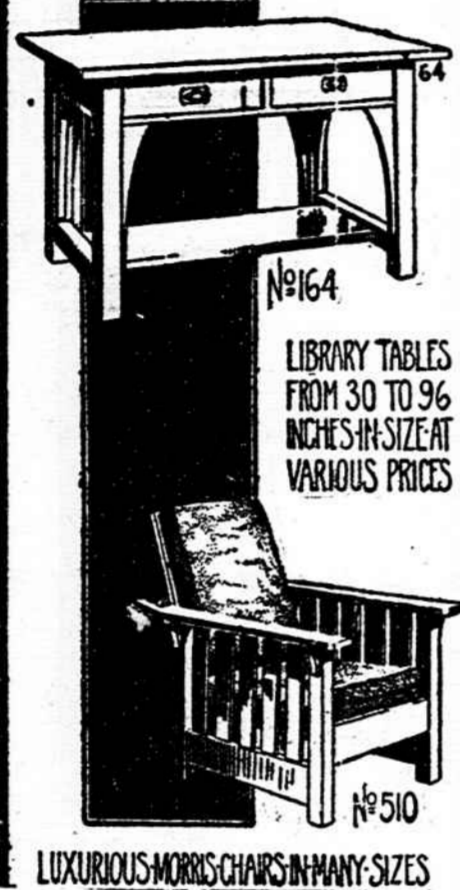

OBITUARIES

E. S. J. Hayes died at his home near Gilbert, S. C., September 19th, 1912, in the 65th year of his age, after several months' illness. In his death the community loses one of its best citizens and the county a loyal and patriotic son. He possessed many noble traits of character, which commanded the respect of all with whom he had intercourse. He served as a member of the County Registration Board up until the first of April of this year. At the beginning of the war between the States he enlisted and served with distinguished gallantry until the close in 1865. As a soldier he was not known to shirk duty, no truer or braver soldier ever shouldered a musket or wore a grey jacket than E. S. J. Hayes. During the exposure in service he contracted rheumatism from which he suffered until death. The immediate cause of his death was paralysis. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Julia A., two daughters, Misses Pinkie and Carrie and one son, Ibor. The funeral services were conducted at St. Matthews by Rev. N. N. Burton, assisted by the Revs. Jacob Edwards and C. S. Felder. Early in life he connected himself with the Baptist church and died a consistent member of the same. Loving and tender hands covered his grave with beautiful flowers as a token of kindness to one who has crossed the river from whose bourne no traveler ever returns. Cor.

Mrs. Livy Ann, wife of Jacob Bouknight, was born June 12, 1838, and died September 29, 1912, making her earthly sojourn 44 years, 2 months and 17 days. She was married to Mr. Bouknight in 1862. To this union was born eight children—one son and seven daughters, all of whom are living. She leaves these with their father, her devoted husband, with a dear mother, several sisters and brothers with many relatives and friends to sorrow after her. She had the misfortune to be badly burned, which resulted in her death twenty-two hours afterwards. She suffered intense misery until death came as a relief to her aching body. She lived a consistent Christian life throughout her long life. The burial services were rendered according to the Lutheran church. She had many relatives and friends at Bethlehem, Black Creek who saw her go the way of all flesh.

Read instructions below before remitting:

According to law the County Auditor will add the following penalties:
On January 1st, 1913, 1 per cent. penalty will be added to those who have not paid. On February 1st, 1913, an additional 1 per cent. will be added to those who have not paid, making 2 per cent. penalty for February. Still an additional 5 per cent. penalty will be added on March 1st, making 7 per cent. penalty to be paid by those who have not paid by March 1st, 1913.

Tax Books will close March 15, 1913. When remitting give each township or school district your property is in. (Give one name in full, not initials.)
