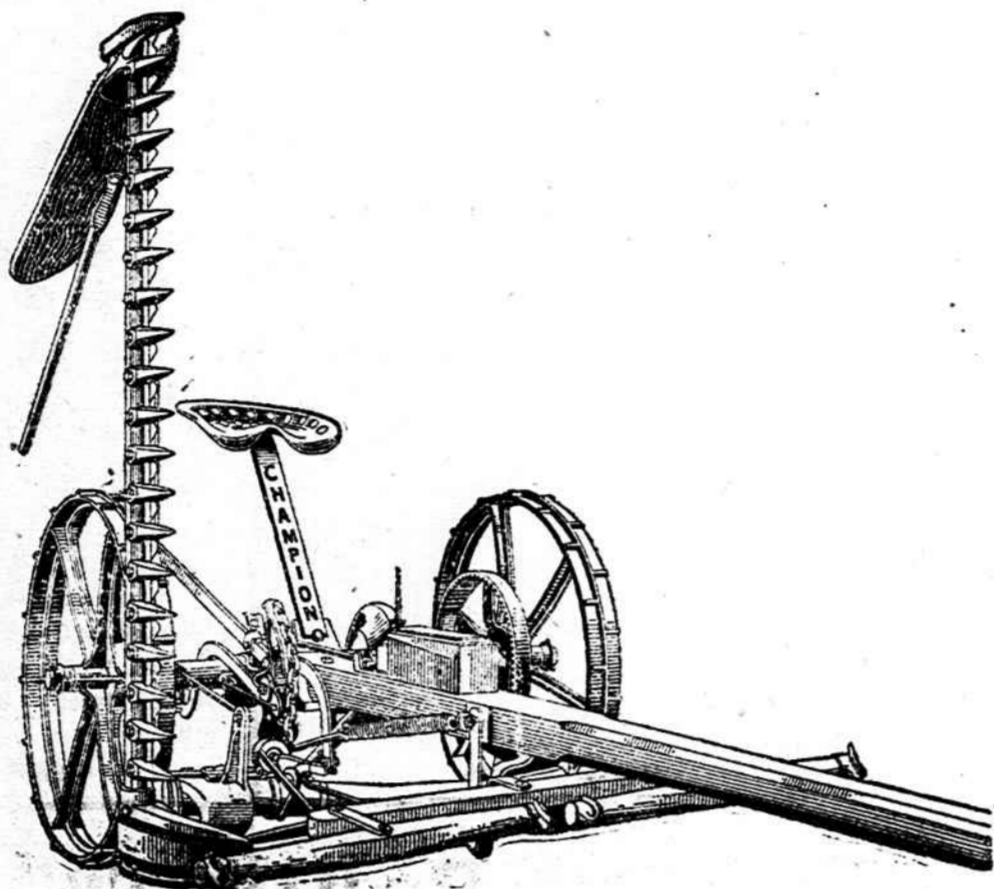

Killed at Cayce.

Joseph T. Koennecke, Sr., residing
at Columbia, conductor of a Seaboard
Air Line switching crew, working in
the Cayce yards, across the Congaree
from Columbia, was run over by a
locomotive Friday night and so badly
hurt that he died in a hospital five
hours later. Mr. Koennecke was found
by the crew of an incoming freight
train, lying on a track, unconscious,
with both legs crushed below the
knee, bruised about the body in several
places and with a wound in his scalp.
No one could be found that night
who could say just how the accident
occurred. The presumption advanced
by fellow-employees was that Mr.
Koennecke, in avoiding one locomo-
tive, stepped in the path of another.
Mr. Koennecke, aged about 45, was
one of the most popular veteran rail-
road men of Columbia. He was for
15 years a yardmaster here for the
Southern railway. He had been in
the service of the Seaboard Air Line,
in the capacity of yard conductor and
night yardmaster, for six or seven
months.
"J. T. Koennecke came to his death
by being run over by Seaboard Air
Line engine 423 while in the discharge
of his duties," according to the ver-
dict in the coroner's inquest held Sun-
day at Columbia.

**Veterans of 61 to Visit Gettys-
burg.**

Harrisburg, Pa., June 14.—More than
40,000 applications have been filed with
the Gettysburg semi-centennial cele-
bration commission from Pennsylvania
for transportation to the historic town
to participate in the four days' cele-
bration beginning July 1. About
1,300 Pennsylvanians who served in
Pennsylvania regiments and are living
in other States have applied, as have
1,800 men who served in Union regi-
ments from other States and are now
living in Pennsylvania. Two hun-
dred Confederate veterans living in
this State have asked for transporta-
tion and quarters and there have also
been filed papers by 400 former regu-
lar army soldiers and 300 men from
the navy who are entitled to be guests
of the State. It is said that Gettys-
burg will be crowded to its uttermost.

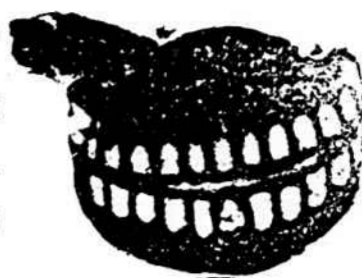
