Any party liable to Commutation Road Tax may, before January 1, 1914, pay \$3.00 commutation tax, in lieu of working the roads six days.

According to law the County Auditor will add the following penalties:

On January 1st, 1914, 1 per cent. penalty will be added to those who have not paid. On February 1st, 1914, an additional 1 per cent. will be added to those who have not paid, making 2 per cent. penalty for February. Still an additional 5 per cent. penalty will be added on March 1st., making 7 per cent. penalty to be paid by March 1st, 1914. Tax books will be closed March 15, 1914. When remitting give each township or school district your property is in. Give your name in full not your initials.
