## Lost Dog—\$5.00 Reward.

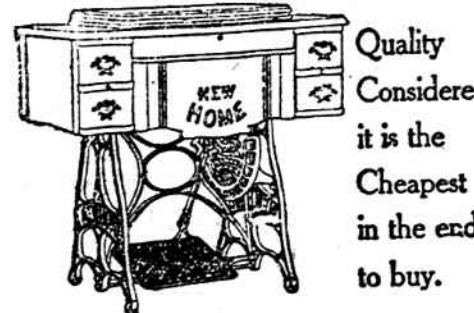
