Nine negroes were killed and 25 persons are known to have been injured in Mermentan and vicinity. Among several whose injuries are believed to be fatal is John Bronesard, a well known planter and a member of the Mermentan city council. At Egan five negroes were killed and 20

After serving a short time he escaped, but was recaptured, and after serving about 18 months of his three years' sentence he again made his escape and has been at large ever since until a few days ago, when he was arrested by the authorities at Potts' Camp.


