IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT DIVISION No. 11 embraces the limits of 33rd Regiment, lying in Newberry from mouth of 2nd creek, Maj. Wadlington, Newberry College, Sampson Merchants to Chalmers old mills, the mouth of Little River on Saluda, and that all persons, firms, companies and corporations engaged in any business, occupation or profession within the limits aforesaid, for which a license is required, must register their names with me in the manner required by law for licenses from May 1st, 1865, to May 1st, 1866, and from May 1st, 1866, to May 1st, 1867. This class embraces merchants, traders, professional-men, distillers, pedlars, manufacturers, tobaccoists, cigar-makers, brokers, insurance agents, &c., &c.
