COUNCIL CHAMBER,

Newberry, S. C.

An Ordinance to preserve the peace and good order of the Town of Newberry and to establish police regulations for the same.

Be it ordained by the Town Council, and by authority of the same that after the passage of this Ordinance, it shall be the duty of the Marshal to arrest all persons guilty of misdemeanors or lighter crimes, within the corporate limits of the Town of Newberry, by violation of the laws of the State of South Carolina, or by violation of any Ordinance of the Town of Newberry, and bring them before the Intendant or a warden acting in his stead, whom the Intendant may appoint for that purpose, at such hour as may be designated from time to time, for a daily police Court and that the Intendant or Warden acting in his stead shall have power to pass such order in the premises as in his opinion justice may require consistently with the authority of the Council, in such case provided.

Be it further ordained, that it shall be the duty of the Marshal, after the arrest of any person, whose violation of law interferes with the peace and good order of the Town of Newberry, or the conduct of the person arrested, after the arrest is made, is such as to impair the peace and good order of the Town to closely confine such person, and to produce him as herein before directed for examination, or proper administration of criminal justice may require.

Be it ordained, that any person riding upon the side-walk, or leading horses thereon except to cross the same, be held guilty of a misdemeanor, and be punished at the discretion of the Council, within the limits of its authority.

Be it further ordained, that any person found drunk in the streets of the Town of Newberry, whereby the peace and good order of the Town is impaired or the convenience of other persons is interfered with, be held guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable at the discretion of the Council within the limits of its authority.

Be it ordained, that the discharge of five arms in the streets or roads, within the corporate limits of the Town of Newberry, be held a misdemeanor, and punished at the discretion of the Council within the limits of its authority.

Be it ordained, that smoking in the Rail Road Depot, or upon any of its platforms, or in any building or public place at the discretion of the Council, within the limits of its authority, and be it further ordained, that the smoking in private warehouses, and stores after notice forbidding such smoking, be held a misdemeanor, and punishable accordingly, as above provided.

Be it further ordained, that the use of false weights and measures, subjects the parties using them, to punishment at the discretion of the Council, within the limits of its authority, besides their liability to be proceeded against otherwise, according to law, and it shall be lawful for the Marshal, from time to time, to examine and test the correctness of all weights and measures used in trade within the corporate limits of Newberry, and to report all violations of law in this particular.

That the Marshal shall take immediate steps to open the streams at the expense of the Town Council, and to notify the land owners and tenants to drain their lands adjacent to the streams; and upon the failure of any one herein required to drain lands adjacent to the streams, that the Marshal shall have the right, and is hereby instructed to enter upon such lands requiring draining, and drain the same, keeping an exact account of the cost of such drainage, and charge the cost to the party whose duty it is to drain the land under this Ordinance and report the same to the Council.

That the person or persons liable to drain lands under this Ordinance, and upon notice failing to render obedience to this Ordinance, shall be held guilty of a misdemeanor, and be punished with fine at the discretion of the Council within the limits of its authority, besides being otherwise proceeded against according to law.

Be it further ordained that all causes of sickness within the corporate limits of Newberry, or other nuisance, be removed or abated as far as may be by the owners or occupants of the lots upon which such causes of sickness or nuisance may exist, upon notice to that effect, and that such persons failing so to remove or abate such causes of sickness or nuisance, shall be held guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable with fine at the discretion of the Council, within the limits of its authority, besides being liable to be otherwise proceeded against according to law.

That it shall be the duty of the Marshal upon the failure of the owners and occupants of lots to remove or abate any cause of sickness or other nuisance as herein provided to enter upon such lots, and remove or abate such causes of sickness or other nuisance, and keep an exact account of such removal or abatement and report the same to the Council.

That it shall be the duty of the Marshal to look closely and vigilantly to the improvement of the sanitary condition of the Town, and that he promptly report everything that in his opinion impairs the same.
