 WASHINGTON, May 16.
 Mrs. Dr. Mary E. Walker is still determined to bring herself prominently before the public. Yesterday she visited Dr. Metcalf, chief clerk of the Interior Department, and made formal application in writing for the position of Librarian. To-day she made her appearance at the door of the room of the Commissioner of Patents, an applicant for an interview with that official. While patiently waiting her turn to be admitted, Mrs. General Gaines, of Louisiana, emerged from the Commissioner's room, and, after eyeing the "woman in breeches" for a while, addressed her with the question, "Is this Mrs. Dr. Walker?" The fair doctor replied affirmatively. Mrs. Gaines said: "Will you allow me to give you a piece of advice?" Dr. Walker: I will not pay anything for your advice, but if it is given freely I will be happy to receive it. Mrs. Gaines: I shall make no charge for it, and if you act upon it you will be benefited by it. Dr. Walker intimated her readiness to hear. 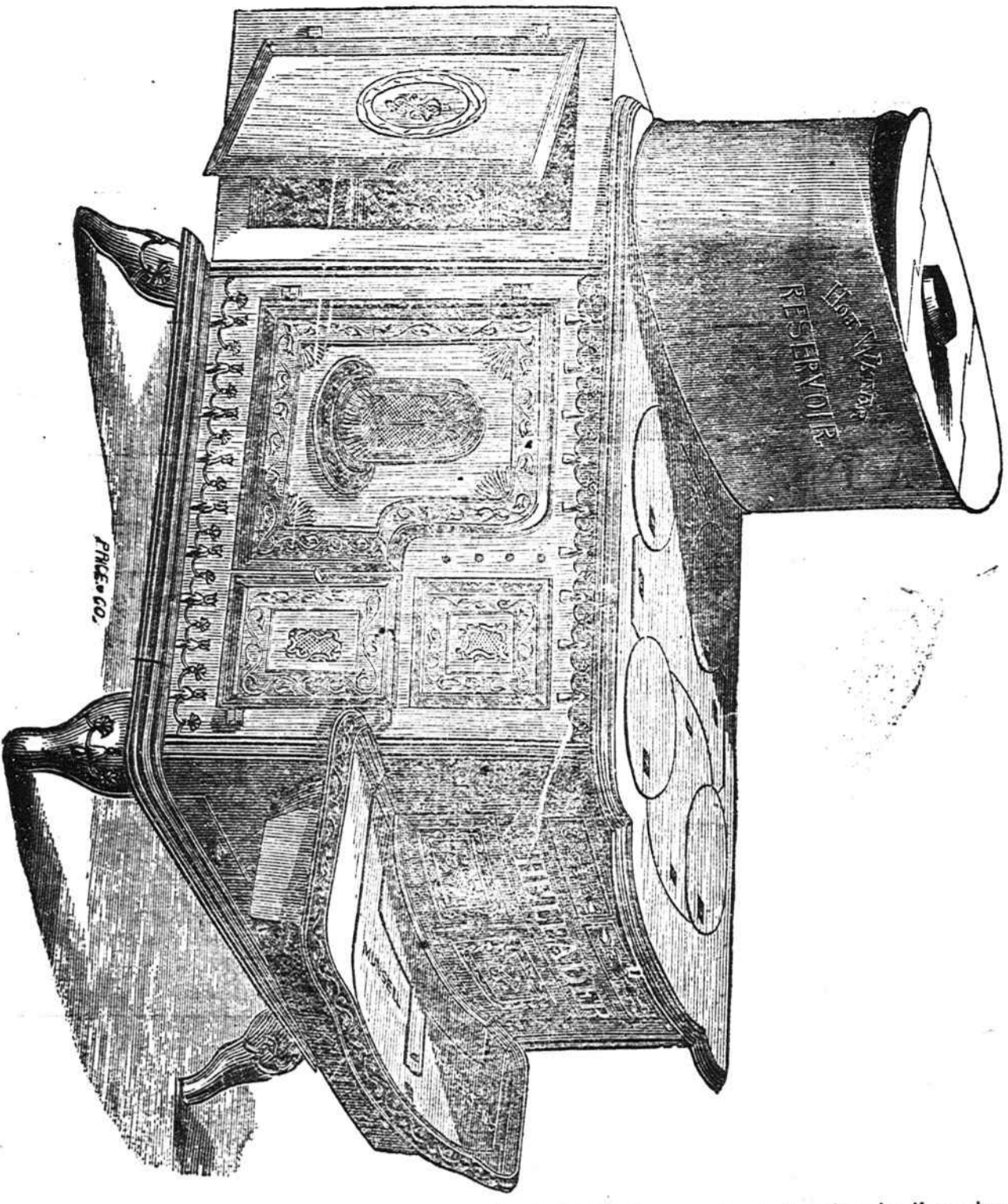
