To School Trustees in Newberry County.

THE attention of the different School Trustees in this County is especially directed to the important order of the State Superintendent of Education; J. K. JILLSON, attached below, by which it will be seen that they are required and directed to hold meetings in their respective Townships, on the 24th of June inst. A careful perusal is requested.

NOTICE TO SCHOOL COMMISSIONERS.
OFFICE OF STATE SUP'T OF EDUCATION, COLUMBIA, S. C., May 24, 1871.
To Each of the County School Commissioners:
You are hereby requested to instruct the Boards of School Trustees of the several School Districts in your County to call meetings of the legal voters of their respective School District on Saturday, June 24, 1871, at 12 o'clock M., notice of the time and place of such meeting to be given by the Clerk of the Board of Trustees by posting written or printed notices in three (3) public places of the School District at least ten (10) days before said meeting. Your special attention is invited to the following extracts from "An Act to amend an Act entitled an Act to establish and maintain a system of free common schools for the State of South Carolina," approved March 6th, 1871:
Sec. XXIX. The County Treasurer shall pay for all moneys by him received, which shall have been assessed by virtue of the vote of any District meeting as hereinafter provided for, in the County in which such District is situated, on the order of the Clerk of the Board of Trustees of said District, countermanded by the County School Commissioner, to be used for the purpose directed by the District meeting so held. Said money shall be assessed and collected at the time, and in the manner that County taxes are assessed and collected; and if the inhabitants of any School District, at their annual District meeting, shall fail to provide for the raising of such sum, then the County School Commissioner of the County in which such District is situated, shall be required to withhold from said District that part of the State appropriation derived from the revenue of the State, and to apportion and distribute the same to the other Districts of the County which have complied with the requirements of this Act: Provided, That in School Districts where there are less than one hundred children between the ages of six and sixteen, the inhabitants may raise such a sum, per child, as will be sufficient to maintain their schools.
Sec. L. The following persons shall be entitled to vote at any District meeting, viz:
All persons possessing the qualification of electors as defined by the Constitution of this State, and who shall be residents of the District at the time of offering to vote at said meeting.
Sec. LI. The inhabitants qualified to vote at a school meeting, lawfully assembled, shall have power:
1st. To appoint a Chairman to preside over said meeting.
2d. To adjourn from time to time.
3d. To choose a Clerk, who shall possess the qualification of a voter.
4th. To raise by the addition to the amount apportioned by the State to their use, such further sums of money as they may deem proper for the support of public schools, said sum not to be more than three dollars for every child in the District between the ages of six and sixteen, as ascertained by the census taken at the last meeting to be collected by the County Treasurer, and to be held by him, subject to the order of the Trustees, countermanded by the County School Commissioner, such sums of money to be used as shall be agreed upon at the meeting, either for the pay of teachers' salary or purchase or lease sites for school houses; to build, hire or purchase such school houses; to keep them in repair, and furnish the same with necessary fuel and appendages; or to furnish black-boards, outline maps and apparatus for illustrating the principles of science, or to discharge any other liabilities, or to apply to the County Treasurer for money to be used for any other purpose belonging to the District, when the same shall no longer be needful for the use of the District.
7th. To alter or repeal their proceedings, from time to time, as occasion may require, and to do any other business contemplated in this Act.
