Fasten the door with a strong wooden pin in the staple, and the mule that is inside the stable will stay there until he is turned out. He may paw and bang all day long but can do no damage. There is no batten within reach of his hoofs. It is on the outside, rendering the door impregnable against his heaviest attacks.

TO PREVENT CATTLE JUMPING. -A correspondent of the Vermont Farmer thus describes an im proved poke or jumping stick : First, put a piece across the horns. Then have a piece of hard wood board, one-half or three-fourths inch thick and about three feet long .- Have a hole inserted in the bar across the horns in such a way that when this hard wood strip is inserted in it, running out over the back, as the animal naturally carries its head, the rear end will be just free of the back. Drive three or four shingle nails ground sharp, into this end, letting them come through three-fourthof an inch, so that as soon as the animal makes an effort to raise his head to jump the fence, the nails will soundly prick his back. and he will be apt to frisk his tail and start for some feed that is easier to be obtained. For cheapness and durability this at rangement is unequalled. weighs less than three pounds; it

is not in the way in travelling around, and when the animal lies down it is on one side, as it is natural for the animal to throw its head opposite to the side at lies on. When they are freding it is apright in the air. It will keep the animal to which it is applied where he belongs, succ.

PLASTER OF PARIS AS A MANURE FOR VINES .- I have a large quan tity of grap vines planted in the open ground. In planting the-I had the holes dug about twenty five inches deep; I then threw into each hole five or SIX lumbs old plaster, about the size of my fist. I threw a little earth over these lumps, and then planted the vines in the usual way. The result has been wonderful; the vines. which were not an inch thick when planted three years ago are now two inches and more in diameter and bear finely. The grapes are also freer from disease. Other vines, not so treated, are much smaller and produce less, the fruit being also more liable to disease. To try the effect of this plaster, in planting two American black walnuts, we put the plaster to one and not to the other. The former grew twice as fast as the other. Last year we dug about the roots of the one to which no plaster was put, and we threw in seven or eight lumps of plaster among the roots; the trees are cl now both of the same size, and though only four years old, are Greenville & Columbia Railroad. 16 or 17 feet high.-P. Corn Candy .- 1 saw a request for a recipe for corn candy in a former number of your paper. It that is what is sometimes called "corn cake," the following is a good recipe.

Prepare the molasses candy. viz : one cup of sugar, one tablespoonful of vinegar, a piece of butter the size of a walnut; boil fifteen minutes. After the corn is nicely popped, pick it over. and remove all kernels not popped. then chop it rather fine. Take just enough of the molasses to mix the corn thoroughly. It will mix better if rather warm. Place the mixture in a pan to the depth of about an inch; place another pan in this with a heavy weight. so as to press the corn nicely. In a few hours it will be quite hard and can be cut into any desired Arrive at Walhalla form."-Household.

Pickled Cabbage. - Cut the cabbage quite fine, Seaving out the hearts, and put from one pint to one quart of salt to a barrel of cabbage. Sprinkle the salt in layers while filling the barrel and use a pounder quite freely, so that when filled a nice pickle is formed. Place a board on the cabbage and lay on a weight so the pickle will cover the board. In ten days or a fortnight it will be ready for use. Keep in the cellar. To be eaten Keep in the cellar. To be eaten cold or fried in a spider where pork has been cooked and a little vinegar poured over it.




