SOUP-MAKING.

There is no way in which the comfortable abundance of a table may be better insured, while at the same time a strict eye is kept upon economical expenditure of means, than by an almost daily addition of soup to the family dinner. It is only when concocted by an indifferent cook that soup dcserves the contemptuous sobriquet of 'slops,' se often applied to it. It is suprising from what a scan-

ty allotment of material a dainty dish of soup may be supplied. Let a roast of beef be consumed to the very bone, a turkey or pair of fowls deprived of every joint, yet if the carcass is put away, it furnishes at once the needed

Cover the vessel with a close-fitting advise no one to try to preserve. lid, and set it by a slow fire; this will draw out all the virtue of herbs and roots, giving the soup a different flavor from what is imparted by putting the full quantity of water in at first. the gravy produced is almost dried up, too much to allow.

When your soup is done take it off the fire to cool, and skim thoroughly from grease. Put it on again, and be sure not to dish it up unless boiling hot. Be careful to add salt and other high flavored condiments sparingly; every table is supplied with salt-cellar and easters so that a deficiency in these respects may be easily rectified; not so an over quantity. LIME AROUND APPLE TREES.

We have known some farmers make it a regular practice for a number of years to throw caustic lime around their apple trees in the spring and summer. We once noticed that a tree standing in the immediate vicinity of our dwelling, had all at once put forth with renewed energy, and we were at a loss for son e time to define the cause. On examination we found that a quantity of lime that had accidentally been spilled and rendered worthless by becoming mixed with the refuse on the stable floor, had been thrown at the foot and around the tree, and to this, as the principal cause, we immediately attributed the reviviscence and renewed fructuation of the tree.

Taking the hint from the accident, we purchased twelve casks of lime, and applied half a bushel to each of the trees in our orchard, and found that it produced immediate beneficial effects. Not the health of the trees only, but the quality of the fruit was also greatly improved. This application will be especially beneficial to soils where there is a redundance of vegetable matter. We would advise our farmers, in some places, especially in new forest lands recently cleared, and on low lands, to make a trial of this experiment, and see whether it is not deserving of the high recommendation it secures .- Exchange,




