OATS VS. CORN FOR LIVE STOCK.

Concerning this subject, Dr. Jones, the commissioner of agriculture, of Georgia, writes as follows: Taking into consideration the cost of production, the chemical analysis and the comparative freedom from stealage, oats are cheaper as stock food than corn.

In fat-producing properties, corn has seven per cent., oats six per cent. It will be seen, therefore, that when equal weights only are compared, corn has the advantage as a fat producer.

Onions for medicinal purposes.—Cover two quarts of white onions with soft water; stew them in a jelly, strain through a cloth or fine sieve; weigh the liquid and add an equal weight of dark brown sugar, (the commoner the better); simmer all together until it is of the consistency of molasses.

To Drive off Rats.—Rats will leave the premises if chloride of lime is dropped where they feed. If they get it on their feet they will be careful not to travel again on the same track.

Rice Cup-Cakes.—Take half pound of the best rice; cook until thoroughly done; turn into cups; when cold place on a dish, and serve with milk, a little granulated sugar, some grated nutmeg, and a table-spoonful of any kind of jelly or preserve fruits, such as blueberries.

A screw may be firmly inserted in a plastered wall or partition by making a hole about twice the size of the screw and fill with plaster of paris.

CARE OF STOCK.—The fact that stock which is not prospering is just a machinery for the destruction of farm produce, ought to startle many a man who will read these words.

RICE BALLS.—Boil a quarter of a pound of nice rice, which has been washed and rubbed thoroughly, in a quart of new milk sweetened to taste; add salt and two ounces of sweet almonds blanched and minced very fine; when the rice is tender, press into small cups which have been dipped into cold water.

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Sour Stomach.—A sufferer from want of appetite and sour stomach can be greatly benefited by leaving all medicines alone and for a time existing entirely on milk and lime water; a teaspoonful of lime water to a tumbler of milk. If this disagrees in any way, increase the quantity of lime water.
