

Rural free delivery seems to have passed the experimental stage and to have become an established part of the postal system of the country. The report of First Assistant Postmaster General Heth shows that there are now about 400 distributing points, from which letters are de-livered in 40 States and one Territory. The appropriation for the current year is \$450,000; but for the next fiscal year Congress appropriated \$1,500,000, which will permit a considerable extension of the system. At present almost half a million peo-ple are served by the rural carriers, and in some instances so many fourth-class post offices have been superseded that free delivery has proved cheaper than the old We hope our Representatives will look to the interest of this section in the increased appropriation.
