Labor Scarce in the South.

New Orleans, November 6.—A famine in labor prevails throughout Mississippi. It has grown acute and is seriously interfering with harvesting the cotton crop.

Boyd Barnhardt, a carpenter, of Williamsport, Pa., has sued Miss Laura Updegraff, a member of one of the best families in that region, for \$38, the value of certain articles presented to her while he was courting her.

Negro Burned at the Stake.

Sardis, Miss., November 1.—One negro, name unknown, has been burned at the stake and two white men, implicated by the negro in his dying confession, are being held by a posse pending an investigation in the murder of E. O. Jackson and a mill owner named Roselle at Darling, Miss., Wednesday night.

The negro was burned at Darling last night by a mob composed of 4,000 persons from both races. Just before the lighting of the funeral pyre the captured negro confessed that he had committed the double murder with the assistance of two white men.

After the burning a posse went in search of the two white men and soon captured them. They are being held pending an investigation of their guilt or innocence and it is believed that a double lynching will follow if guilt is proven conclusively.

Later it was learned that the two white men were released by the mob, an alibi having been proven by each man. No further trouble is expected to-night.

Newry, S. C., November 3, 1902.—Mr. and Mrs. Fred Unger entertained quite a number of their friends at a Halloween party last Friday evening.

Three of the gentlemen were at the dock to receive, each wearing a mask that was made to look as ghost-like as possible. The hall was dimly lighted, pumpkins being used with eyes, mouth and nose cut in them and candles burning within.

Last Saturday night, Nero Hollams, an old and worthy colored citizen, residing at Norris Station, near Central, in Pickens county, was sitting in a room in his house when he was shot and killed.
