A MILLION WAS SUBSCRIBED.

Amount will be Expended in the Far East and Latin America.

Washington, Oct. 22.—Contributions of one million dollars for the world wide expansion of the Young Men's Christian Association, \$540,000 of which was given by John D. Rockefeller, were announced to-day at the conference of Young Men's Christian workers in the East Room of the White House. President Taft addressed the delegates and heartily endorsed the organization.

Mr. Rockefeller's gift, tendered on the condition that a like amount be raised, was met by contributions from many laymen interested in the movement, among them John Wannamaker.

Mr. Wannamaker offered to erect another building in China in addition to five foreign association buildings already given by him.

Dr. John R. Mott, general secretary of the World's Student Christian Federation, outlined a program for expansion of the movement. The plan involves the addition of fifty experts in the Far East during the next three years to direct the policy, the erection of 49 buildings in ten nations to provide proper equipment for such expansion and \$1,515,000 in money to cover the cost of the equipment. The countries to be benefited include the Philippines, Japan, Korea, China, India and Ceylon, Russia, Turkey, Porto Rico, Cuba and Portugal.

RESCUED PRISONER SET FREE.

Prisoner's Friends Swoop Down on Virginia Jail After Midnight.

Livingston, Va., Oct. 21.—Mountaineer friends of John Moore, under sentence to be electrocuted for the murder of Frank Howl, descended upon the Nelson county jail here at 1 o'clock this morning, stormed the building and rescued the prisoner.

It is supposed he will be taken to the mountains and liberated. When the people of the county seat were asleep, a crowd of 75 fully armed men from the mountain section, where the crime was committed, proceeded quietly to the county jail. Admission was gained to the building and the guards awed into comparative non-resistance. The cell where Moore was locked up soon was found and he was taken out.

It is feared that bloodshed will result from any attempt of the authorities to recapture the murderer. Moore was condemned to pay the death penalty by electrocution at Richmond on November 25. He had been convicted of having murdered Frank Howl in Nelson county last May. Many of the mountaineer friends of the condemned man believed him innocent of the crime. The only telephone wire leading to the section of the country where the crime was committed and where Moore's friends live was cut before the operation was begun. This leads to the belief that Moore was carried there for release.
