Columbia, Sept. 30,-Senator John L. McLaurin has been called to New York, presumably for a conference on the cotton situation. It will be remembered that in August he suggested in a letter to President Wilson that the allies be extended a credit for the purchase of supplies in this country. Senator McLaurin said he had reason to believe that the Germans were buying cotton here; that it was inconceivable that a nation so munition of war. Even if peace were declared to-morrow and England had the surplus cotton, she could compel the continent to buy it at a large profit. Asked what made him say Germany was buying cotton, he said. "Well, I think it better not to say too much: business people don't want their affairs paraded in the newspapers."

It is magnificent the way the farmers are holding. The present advance is due to cheap money. Low prices in the fall have come heretofore from the contraction of credit. This is the first time that we have had extension of credit just when needed, at the crop marketing period.

#### Direct Sales.

Col. Thackston said that "in the development of the State warehouse system we have just reached the really big thing in it-direct sales of cotton from the farm to the consumer. This means a stable price for cotton and standardization of grades. The commissioner has done a great work in providing negotiable lagra Hospital in Spartanburg. security which enables the gradual marketing of the crop, but, after all, borrowing money on cotton is a mere temporary expedient; the main thing is to sell advantageously. We do not grow cotion to warehouse; we grow "My plans at present have not been

formulated, and I prefer to say nothing until after more mature deliberation and a more thorough acquaintance with the plans of the Federal government. I will say, however, that the result can only be achieved by the co-operation of the individual farmers. The organization of the farmers for marketing purposes is the foundation. I believe that the success in securing credits at this unusual time for the advance of cotton prices at the marketing period is such a lesson that the farmers of the South are prepared now to go further. It inspires them with confidence, and teaches them the value of combined effort.

"There is no reason why, with the machinery which Mr. McLaurin has perfected, to wit, the State warehouse system, that the farmers of this State cannot organize and control absolutely the sale of this year's cotton crop."

#### Only in Packages in Florida,

Tampa, Fla., Sept. 30 .- At midnight to-night the Davis package law went into effect throughout the State. Under its provisions saloons will not be allowed to serve patrons at the bar, the law prohibiting any drinking on the premises. Only sealed packages will be sold, of not less than half pint quantity. A number of bar-rooms in this city closed tonight, not to reopen unless the test case being brought before the Supreme Court to test the constitutionality of the act should set aside the law. This test case is brought on the claim that an act designed to be regulatory is in effect prohibitory; also that it is unconstitutional owing to the fact that all of the ground covered in the act is not specified in the title of the bill, which was passed at the 1915 session of the Legislature.

Hotel bars are affected just the same as saloons. There is some question as to whether clubs, which sell only to members, will be allowed to operate. The law provides that saloons must close from 6 p. m. to 7 bard.

COTTON RISE HELPS BUSINESS.

Improved Conditions Reported to the Federal Reserve Board,

Washington, Oct. 1. - Improved business conditions in practically all sections are reflected in reports from Federal reserve agents in the twelve districts, made public to-day by the Federal Reserve Board.

The three Southern districts report that present prices of cotton and efforts of the Federal board to finance the crop have had a beneficial effect. on other lines.

With cotton at present prices, Richmonds reports a large part of the district's crops will move from first hands, and the consequent liquidation of seasonal trade obligations will be generally helpful.

Bright outlook in the cotton market in the Atlanta district, says the report, is an important factor. Railroads show considerable increase in freight traffic.

General conditions in the Dallas district are said to show some improvement over August. The Texas cotton crop is estimated at not more than 3,250,000 bales.
