**ROTTENNESS AT ELLIS ISLAND.**

Characterized as Gambling and Bawdy House and Red Forum.

New York, Nov. 27.—Byron H. Uhl, acting commissioner of immigration at Ellis Island, admitted to the House immigration committee investigating condition here that privileges had been granted during the regime of former Commissioner Frederic C. Howe, which if unchecked, might have led to the establishment of "a forum of Bolshevism" on the island.

Uhl appearing before the committee when it resumed its hearing this morning, made this admission after Chairman Johnson had asked if, under the administration of his predecessor, the island "was not a gambling house, bawdy house and a forum of Bolshevism."

In reply to further questions, Uhl also admitted that previous to the resignation of Mr. Howe last September immoral women had been allowed to circulate among other prisoners and that women had been permitted to roam about the island.

He further admitted that one Chinese crew had indulged in gambling to such an extent that a seaman had lost \$3,000.

After the arrival from Seattle of a trainload of "reds," he said, anarchist papers and literature had been circulated on the island.

"The soviet" continued its hunger strike this noon, refusing dinner, the fifth meal omitted since the strike began. Only three men have deserted, "the cause."

Representative Johnson, chairman of the House committee, announced that he had been informed by the bureau of immigration that application of Alexander Berkman for permission to go from the United States to Russia had been denied.

Public Health Authorities Predict Its Recurrence.

**Bumper World Crops Estimated.**

Washington, Nov. 26.—Bumper world crops of corn, potatoes, barley, rye, sugar beets and rough rice for this year are shown in estimates compiled by the International Institute of Agriculture at Rome, made public to-day by the Department of Agriculture. The production of wheat, oats and flax seed, however, shows a decrease from the average for the five years ended in 1917.

Wheat production in 14 countries, excepting the Central powers, will reach 2,040,509,000 bushels, 96.5 per cent of the five year average. Corn will amount to 3,126,194,000, 14.8 per cent greater than the crop produced last year and 4.1 per cent greater than that produced for the last five years. Other crops, the Department's cablegram shows, are estimated as follows:

Rye, 169,114,000 bushels, 12.4 per cent, five year average.  
Oats, 2,085,786,000 bushels, 90.3 per cent.  
Rice, 123,375,000 bushels, 101.2 per cent.  
Sugar beets, 10,344,000 tons, 174.8 per cent.  
Flax seed, 26,492,000 bushels, 60.9 per cent.

New York, Nov. 27.—Mrs. Felipe Angeles, wife of the Mexican revolutionary leader, was still in ignorance to-day of his execution. Mrs. Carmen Delarosa, her sister, declared she had been so ill that even the news of his arrest had been withheld from her.

Alberto, the general's 20-year-old son, to-day made public a telegram from his father, dated Tuesday afternoon. It read:

"Let the family know that I am serene and contented. I hope that you will be a good man, a patriot and a hard worker. I want you to love your mother, sister and brothers very much. Kisses and embraces.  
"Felipe Angeles."

**WHAT YOUNG GARDENERS DID. The School Gardens Made Millions in Food Value.**

Washington, Nov. 27.—Children enlisted in home gardening under school supervision in the U. S. school garden army have produced, in the little more than a year the work has been in operation, foodstuffs valued at \$48,000,000, the bureau of education, department of the interior, announced.

Reports to the department indicated that every section of the country had active part in the vast harvest. New York City reported a total of \$717,517.20 from the home gardens of 60,654 children, while the little amateur farmers of Chicago realized an average return of \$5. Hundreds of prizes, it was said, have been won at State fairs throughout the country by the children.

Atlanta, with 10,000 gardens planted by children under school supervision, estimated returns in excess of \$52,000. Knoxville, Tenn., children have harvested \$16,263 worth of garden products. Richmond, Va., announced \$22,994 as the result of efforts of 1,200 children, and Roanoke, Va., announced school garden products in excess of \$10,000.

In Greensboro, N. C., the average income of the 951 children enrolled was \$64.47; and six cities, namely, Lynchburg and Danville, Va., Greensboro and Durham, N. C., Chattanooga and Morristown, Tenn., reported a total of \$208,930, produced at a cost to school boards and homes of less than \$17,000.

Donaldson quite well in England and asked many particulars about him. The American airman was decorated on November 22, in New York by the prince, just before he sailed for Europe."

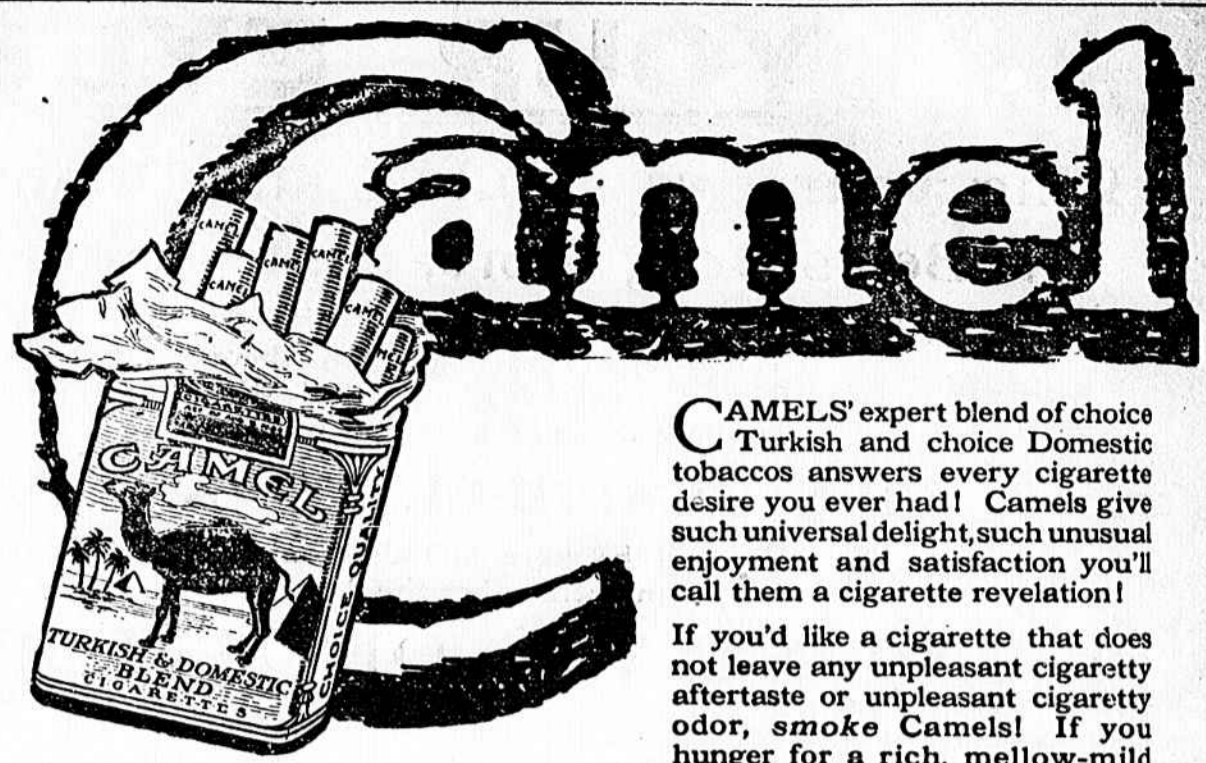

**Reds Raided by Bomb Squad.**

New York, Nov. 25.—A large quantity of chemicals which could easily be converted into explosives were found in a secret room in the headquarters of the United Russian Workers in East Fifteenth street, raided late to-day by detectives attached to the bomb squad. One bottle was labeled "T. N. T."

The detectives who made the raid were armed with Federal warrants for several men connected with the organization, but none of them was found and no arrests were made. While sounding the wall of the room in the rear of the parlor, a detective found a door leading into the secret room in which the chemicals were concealed. On a table there were 50 or 60 small bottles containing the chemicals.
